




Rebati Sante Mentale Haiti Mission Statement

Rebati Sante Mentale Haiti is a non-profit organization dedicated to the overall goal of establishing an effective mental health capability in Haiti, that is an integral part of Haiti health services, policy, and funding, and that provides evidence-based systems, delivery, and treatment strategies. We support that goal through a focus on:

- Coordination of efforts towards these goals through a role of monitoring, capturing, sharing, mapping, and giving visibility to the range of often fragmented efforts in different regions in Haiti
- Highlighting and supporting efforts to bring financial, planning and faculty/mentoring/trainer support for the re-establishment and sustained excellence of psychiatric clinics and hospitals, and for the realization of integrated community primary care health model as part of overall health systems strengthening in Haiti
- Supporting and encouraging efforts that build the capacity of Haitians to sustainably provide these services
- The mobilization and recruitment for direct support and assistance to achieve these goals from Haitian and Creole speaking mental health specialists in Haiti and outside of Haiti
- The mobilization of networks of support from funders, decision makers, governmental and non-governmental health providers



CURRENT INITIATIVES

We are supporting the following projects in 5 crucial areas:

1) **HELPING DEVELOP A MENTAL HEALTH INFRASTRUCTURE WITH HOSPITALS SERVING AS HUBS:** the only 2 psychiatric hospitals Beudet (120 beds for long term care and vocational rehab) and Mars & Kline (60 beds for acute care and crisis) were destroyed after the earthquake: it will cost \$10 million USD to rebuild both hospitals. In addition to these 2 institutions, Haiti needs to build an institute to treat neuropsychiatric disorders, strokes and brain traumas. This hospital will provide cardiac care and rehab for patients who suffer from cerebrovascular accidents and brain trauma or tumors. This new institution will be equipped with a neurosurgical ICU and stroke unit to provide a type of specialized care that is nonexistent in Haiti as we speak. It will cost \$4 million USD to build a state of the art 60-bed medical center.

The 2 hospitals will be state run, but the new institute will be non-for profit and privately run. All 3 medical centers will be affiliated with Haiti medical schools and universities and will serve as teaching and research institutions and also hubs for Haiti mental health system, which will cover a population of 10 million people.

2). **CAPACITY BUILDING MENTAL HEALTH PROJECTS:** Training teachers as therapists (TAT). The fund will support children education and finance teachers training in targeted schools already supported by the "Fond de Parrainage National". This fund is run by a former UNESCO and UN official already supports 33,000 children at a rate of \$100 per year per child. The goal is to expand the fund and help them cover 250,000 children, which means 10% of school age children in Haiti.

3). **INTEGRATIVE MENTAL HEALTH INTO HEALTH CARE:** The third project will support the training of primary care physician as psychopharmacologists (PAP) to bring capacity to mental health and psychiatric care in Haiti where there is only a dozen trained psychiatrist and more than 100 psychologists. It will cost about \$100 per physician to be trained for a total of 1700 primary care physicians. The cost will cover traveling, telecom and lodging of psychiatrist traveling from North America to provide training.

4). **MAPPING OUT SERVICES AND RESOURCES:** The fourth project will help map mental health and crisis services or resources available to Haitians in Haiti and abroad. We will partner with Switchboard of Miami to help establish telephone hotlines to collect and provide information in case of emergency and disasters. Switchboard of Miami is the only Quadrilingual (English, Spanish, French and Haitian Creole) 411 hotline in the US. They were instrumental in passing information from Haiti to the US when most communication lines were shut down. The phone lines will be link to Miami using Switchboard Miami as a hub for call triage and to set up the database. Information from this database will be available to NGOs, public and academic institutions including private sector investors and businesses.

5). **BUILDING COMMUNITY BASED PRIMARY CARE NETWORKS:** The funds will serve for the training of healthcare workers called "Accompagnateurs" to do triage and case management on the field. These cases will be referred to nurses who will provide primary first aid interventions including dispensing meds and giving long acting injections. This primary care delivery system will be structured as a pyramid in which the Accompagnateurs will do case detection and refer them to the nurses. The nurses will be the team leaders and do the triage to assess case complexity to refer patients to the therapists for counseling or the physicians for medication. This fund will cover the training costs for 100,000 Accompagnateurs, 4,000 nurses and 2,000 therapists at a rate of \$100 USD for each trainee. Funds will also cover travel, lodging and telecom for trainers. The goal is to build networks of 16 pyramids of care in Haiti 10 departments.

"Rebati Sante Mentale" is the logical result of the Haitian Mental Health Summit that was convened at the University of Miami on June 26-27, 2010. That Summit itself resulted from the impetus and urgent necessity for an organized coalition of international mental health professionals to: a) assess the preexisting and post disaster mental health situations of the population in Haiti and in the Haitian Diaspora; b) develop specific strategic goals and action plans for working collectively in addressing mental health needs of Haitians; and c) create a network of mental health professionals and stakeholders aimed at addressing behavioral health needs of Haitians.

The Summit was attended by representatives from the Haitian American Psychiatric Association (HAPA), the American Psychiatric Association (APA), the National Institutes of Mental Health (NIMH), New York University (NYU), the State University of New York (SUNY) Downstate Medical Center, the World Psychiatric Congress (WPC), the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine, the University of Miami School of Education, Department of Educational and Psychological Studies, the Haitian Ministry of Health, Partners in Health, the Black Psychiatrists of America (BPA), the American Association of Black Psychologists, and several Haitian mental health professionals (psychiatrists, psychologists, social workers) practicing in New York, Boston, Miami, Chicago, Canada, and Haiti.
